

Dry Tortugas National Park Visitor Docks KEY WEST, FLORIDA

Almost 70 miles west of Key West lies the remote Dry Tortugas National Park. The 100-square mile park is mostly open water with seven small islands. Accessible only by boat or seaplane, the park is the home of historic Fort Jefferson, picturesque blue waters, superlative coral reefs, sensitive marine life, and a vast assortment of birds that frequent the area.

This project involved the dock and pier replacement at Fort Jefferson.

- Pile driving within an environmentally sensitive area.
- Demolition of existing piles and piers.
- Installation of concrete support piles.
- Installation of pre-drill of pile holes as per DOT specifications.
- Forming and pouring of concrete pile caps.
